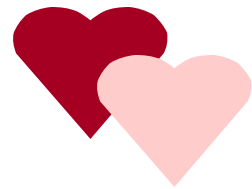

Blink wins the 2012 AKC Eukanuba National Agility Invitational



When my dear friend Mona Lilly asked me to write something about Blink's Invitational win I really didn't know what to say. Blink is an amazing dog, and we sure have worked hard. However part of me never thought we would ever win another National event (Blink was the first TFT to win the AKC Agility Nationals in 2010) because along with hard work, a whole lot of luck has to play into it. (For those who do not know, AKC has two national agility events. The AKC Agility Nationals is held in March. In order to qualify for this event the dogs must achieve qualifying scores and speed points that they can work on throughout the year. All dogs achieving the qualifications may attend. The Invitational is an event based also on qualifications and speed points, but only the top five of each breed are selected).

This was Blink's fifth time competing at Eukanuba. The first two years we only qualified in one run! The third year we actually qualified in three out of four, so I had high hopes for 2011. But alas, we only qualified in one run again! What many people do not realize is that in order to achieve a place in the finals most dogs need to run clean. That means no knocked bars, no off courses, no missed weave pole entrances and no missed contact performances for FOUR runs!!! Yes, sometimes a dog can have a fault and still make finals depending on how many dogs have run clean in that jump height, but typically that is not what happens, especially in the 8 inch class.

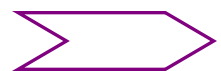
It is very difficult to run four rounds clean with a dog like Blink. Not because he is naughty and doesn't listen, Blink is actually a very good dog, but because one small turn of my body and at his speeds he will misread where I am telling him to go, and he will be off course. Blink can run a Jumpers course in 6 yards per second, that's right up there with many 20 inch dogs!

To make a long story short this was our year to shine. Blink won the Time 2 Beat practice round on Friday, and while I was very happy I was wondering if that was going to be the highlight of my weekend. But he won the first and second round on Saturday, along with \$200 for being in first place after two rounds! On Sunday we placed first after round three and earned another \$300 and also \$300 for the top toy breed! At this point I would have been so disappointed had he earned a fault in the last round, but he qualified and placed first again!! So far he had run five rounds, first place every round. Could he do it in the finals?

I have to say at this point I don't think I would have felt as confident if it were not for the other competitors and Mona. Mona was not competing but just went to watch and work, while visiting her daughter in Florida. It meant so much to me to have every one wishing me luck and telling me they knew we could do it.

Blink did win the finals round, and another \$400 to boot! As well as a \$400 gift certificate from J and J Dog Supplies. I have been told that he is most likely the only dog to ever have placed first in every round and also went on to win! Also, not that many dogs have won both the Nationals and the Invitational, although there have been a few. (Robin Kletke's Papillon Tigger, and Ashley Deacon's Pyrenean Shepherd Luka, are two). By the way, that \$1200 was spent very quickly. On the way home I ordered a new rubberized dog walk from Mark's Agility equipment, as I am going to begin giving agility classes at my home!

I had a judge tell me Blink is a very special dog because it takes so much to hold it together and concentrate in the face of all the distractions, noise, and excitement at a National event such as the



Invitational and the Nationals. But I choose to believe that Blink is a dog that while special, also has specific characteristics that allow him to achieve this kind of success. I truly believe all dogs are special. Certainly there are many dogs doing agility who for whatever reason do not have the speed compared to the other dogs in their jump height. Most likely it is because of structure. Obviously a Dachshund is not going to run as fast as Blink. Some dogs will have an inherited predisposition to shyness, some dogs may be sound sensitive. Are they not special? I believe they are. Every dog doing agility deserves to have a handler who wants that dog to rise to the highest level possible for that specific dog. It's up to us to know what that is. Yes, in Blink's 8 inch jump height, with his confidence and structure I always truly believed he had the potential to win. And he did. But Zizzo, my Italian Greyhound, also made finals this year. And I always believed he could make finals. However, he had a fault in the finals, most likely because he was so worried and scared from all the crowd noise. But I would tell anyone that qualifying every round and making the finals with for Zizzo was in many ways just as much of an accomplishment as winning every run with Blink.

This May it will be six years since I started running Blink, and that means six years for me as well, since he is my first agility dog. I have no idea what the future holds. But I know he and I will always enjoy our runs together and I will always be thankful that he came into my life.

WKC STREAMING VIDEO GOES LIVE AND COMPLETE FOR BREED JUDGING AT ITS 137TH ANNUAL SHOW

Just like being there in person!

For the first time ever, the Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show will produce live coverage of the breed judging for all 187 breeds and varieties via streaming video on its website (www.westminsterkennelclub.org). This coverage will include all of the judging in each of the breeds and varieties, held during the day on Monday and Tuesday, February 11-12.

Would you please put this message on your website so your parent club members and others who visit your website can have some help watching your breed being judged live via streaming video at Westminster next month?

Nine Toy Fox Terriers are judged at 11:15 on Monday, Feb. 11 in Ring 1.

Please note that there may be some other breeds in the ring prior to yours, with the same judging time listed, so judging of your breed may not start at exactly that time. The complete judging schedule for all breeds is available on the Westminster website.

When you log on to the Westminster website, you will see this screen:



Clicking on this will take you directly into the live streaming video page, where you can watch the main curated channel, or select a specific ring channel. If you don't arrive in time to view your breed live, you can watch it from the Westminster archives later. The archive link will also be prominently placed on this same page, as well as listed on the WKC homepage. You will be able to find your breed (or breeds) from a full listing by group as in previous years.



If you have challenges, please refer to the links below for Ustream's instructions and troubleshooting suggestions. You will need a high speed connection to make this work.

More than a million visitors a year have logged on to the Westminster website every year since 2005 during the dog show to view taped breed judging highlights of their favorite breeds, delayed by about two hours from the live competition.

As usual, competition in the Groups and Best In Show will be televised live on CNBC (Monday evening) and USA Network (Tuesday evening), beginning at 8 p.m. each night.

In another technological enhancement for 2013, Westminster is offering an exclusive, WKC-branded SmartPhone App that provides event attendees with a digital 2013 Show Guide. Watch for details on the Westminster website.

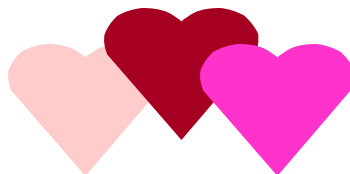

Getting Started in Performance

By Rick Lilly:

Many of you have asked about doing some performance with your TFTs.

First let me say these little guys love to learn and work. When I pick up a leash every one of my dogs say me, me, and me. The things they learn make them better companions and keep them safer.

Today I am going to talk about some Novice level things you can do that do not require any special equipment or are not physically demanding.

I will talk about Agility at a later date.

A very good introduction is the Canine Good Citizen test.

Most training clubs offer a six or eight week class, with a test at the last week.

This test is done on lead, is very basic obedience with hands on brief exam and includes leaving the dog with a stranger while the owner is out of sight.

Most therapy organizations require dogs to have completed the CGC test prior to being accepted, some homeowners insurance even give a break if your dogs have their CGC title.

AKC now has made the CGC a title of record.

Beginner Novice is another good starting place. This is an AKC title and you will need to earn 3 passing scores at an obedience trial.

Healing is done on lead; there is a sit for exam. The handler leaves the dog in a sit stay, and then walks to the end of the six foot lead while the judge touches the dog. There is also a sit stay when the handler leaves the dog in the middle of the ring and walks around the ring then returns to the heal position. The last exercise is the recall. The handler leaves the dog in the sit position walks away, turns, faces the dog and calls on the judge's command. I like this title because only one dog at a time is ever in the ring.

The last title I will touch on today is AKC Rally Novice or RN and UKC RO1 titles

Rally is one of my favorite titles. I like it because you are allowed to talk to your dog as much as you like, again only one dog at a time in the ring. I also enjoy the fact that the course are set by the judges and can be very different from day to day.

In Rally the exercises are printed on cards, set up on a numbered course and no verbal commands from the judge. The handler and the dog perform the exercises in the order set by the judge. The signs are numbered and the handler may walk the course prior to judging.

Signs are available on the AKC website and the UKC website as well.

Many training clubs offer Rally classes. Unless you have prior obedience experience you may need help teaching some of the exercise.

I hope more of you will try some performance, I think you will be glad you did. Oh yeah and you don't need any majors.

Getting to Know You....



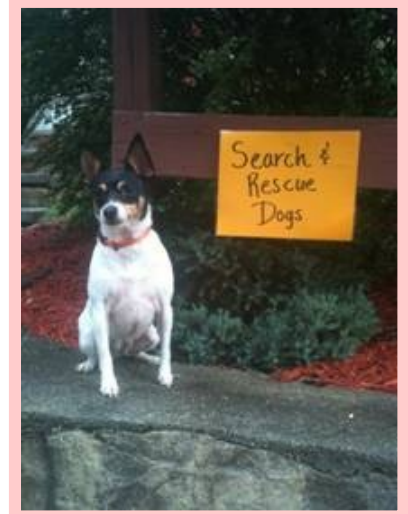

Sniffing it Out

Missy came into my life at a very young age just for socialization. After a while she just fit. Our family fell in love with her and we have not been the same since.

Missy and I started out conformation showing and made it into the UKC Top Ten and a Grand Champion. She then went on to become a mom which cut her show career off. So we tried Rally, Agility, and Obedience (no titles, just to give us something to do).

I felt Missy would be a good candidate to work cadaver searches on water. At that time, I belonged to a local Search and Rescue group that started us off. So I started training land searches at home and keeping our training logs in 2009.

The search team members, at first, didn't want to be associated with a small dog doing searches. I was able to change their minds when I researched and shared an article about another smaller dog with an Ohio County Sheriff's Department doing Narcotic work. Then she started training with the team.

She has traveled all over West Virginia for training and to Western Carolina University in North Carolina. Her trainings have included double-blinded searches (no one knows where it is), to blinded searches (at least one of knows), to "HELLO HERE IT IS!!". She always wants to work and always gives it her all.

Our local city police canine officer set up a search area to help us train in early October 2012. I let my partner and her dog go first. Then it was our turn. Huge warehouse building that was being set up for a Halloween Haunted House. Afterwards he pulled my partner over and gave her some tips. I asked what could we have done better and he said nothing. He said he would use us in the future if needed.

Almost the end of October, the same local law enforcement requested her help in searching for one, possibly two bodies, believed to have been murdered and dumped at a location. It was funny to hear big police men go from a deep burly voice to a squeaky girl voice when she came out of the car (you know what I mean, ha ha). She went and greeted them then started off to work. She had to work 300 yards (that is three football fields butt to butt) along the banks of a major waterway searching. She found nothing (could be good and bad). After the search ended I set up a demo so they could see how she works and she did exactly what she needed to do. The men were happy with how she worked and our professionalism and said they would use us again.

Just like in obedience, rally, and agility you have good days and bad. You strive for more good days as families are depending on your service. I do not charge for our service and Missy only charges me a bite of something good to eat.

So we will take any and every opportunity to work in this field so we can work together and give back to the community to help families find closure.
