Our National is August 21 in Topeka, Kansas. We will have a regional and supported entries that weekend as well. Tabs Dvorak is the Show Chair and Onofrio will be the superintendent. Tabs and Laura Johnson are working the awards for the show. Rebekah Rivera is working the show sponsorships. Please consider sponsoring a class or award. In the last President's Notes, I shared we had discovered this year that our exempt status had been revoked in 2016. I am very pleased to let you know that in February the IRS not only granted our exemption status with our new application for a 501(c)4 - they made it retroactive back to the date they revoked it!

The Board recently approved using another payment platform, we have added Cheddar Up as a way for you to pay for dues, sponsorships, raffle tickets, etc. We recognize not everyone uses checks anymore and we wanted a method that people would find easy to use. Cheddar Up is specifically for clubs and nonprofit organizations. It will help the club avoid the fees we've been paying to PayPal, and we can also set up 'stores' to help keep the various payments directed to what is being paid for which will make life easier for the Treasurer. PayPal will still be available, but please add the fee when its used.

We have initiated a Constitution and By Laws committee. There are some small corrections that need to be made, we need to update/broaden what events we support and possibly adding a membership category for our members who are aging out of the sport but who we'd like to see stay a part of our club. Laura Johnson has volunteered to lead the committee, and information will be coming out this summer with the changes the committee proposes for your review.

We are looking forward to another busy year promoting and supporting our wonderful breed. If you have any ideas of things you'd like the club to consider adding to our agenda or being involved in just reach out to any officer or board member. Please consider being involved in one or more of our events or committees. As they say, it takes a village for us to do all we do and you are our village. Again, thank you to everyone for all you do for our breed. You rock!

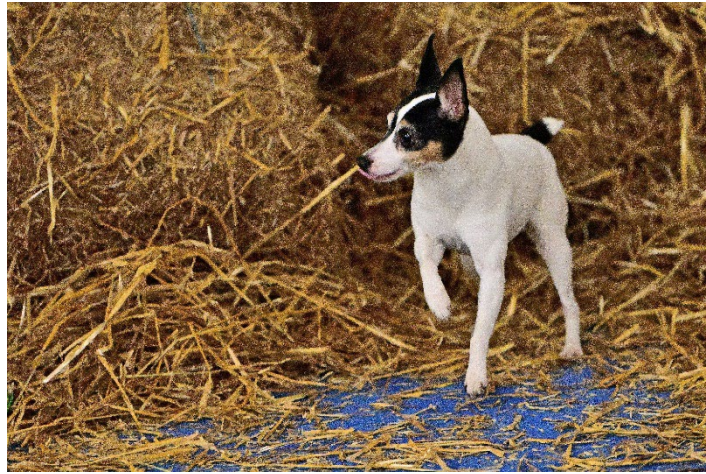

You just NEVER know...Finding your Toy Fox Terrier's sweet spot

As an “old salt” I have had the pleasure of being at the helm of a fast sailboat with the sails trimmed to perfection flying in that “sweet spot” experiencing an incomparable exhilaration.... My point?

Determining the venue(s) that can become your Toy Fox's happy place may be far more challenging and complex than the aforementioned example. But the rewards of successful choosing are far more enduring than the above-mentioned thrill! (Although there ARE those rare moments of elation/exhilaration that can sustain us through the inevitable hard work and even frustration.)

Case in point is my sweet (but salty) Tessa – Tessa (Dynasty Can't Take My Eyes Off You) began her life with me at 6 months of age as a stunning show prospect. Her sweet and willing nature made her easily trainable although her adjustment to urban life with its accompanying noise and stimulation presented a challenge. After a suitable training period, we attended a couple of carefully chosen shows with well vetted judges. Unfortunately (for me) she made it VERY clear that she wanted No part of show biz even though every judge complimented and rewarded her in spite of herself. So, my long held “rule” kicked in: Showing is to be enjoyable for BOTH human and dog. I believe it is morally wrong to endlessly subject a dog to something it hates. (Baths excepted!) And before you conclude that my (longstanding) rule is unnecessarily harsh and that we just needed more “work”, let me note that in my previous dog life and breed (shelties) I handled my foundation bitch to numerous (pre-Herding) Working Group wins and placements competing against some of the top dogs in the country, making Tuffet the top winning Sheltie bitch for the six months she was specialed. I fully “know when to hold ‘em and know when to fold ‘em”! Several years passed before I began agility training with Tessa. She was SO biddable and liked the open spaces and relative quiet that agility offered. Unfortunately, her promising agility career was ended abruptly by injury (mine).

More time passed as Dickens arrived on the scene and became center stage with his conformation career. After his retirement, I decided to try Tessa (and him) at BarnHunt with a personal goal to learn the fine points of scent and various tells (alerts) much more in depth than in my previous excursion into the sport several years prior (with previous dogs) but ONLY if the dogs showed enjoyment in participating.

I quickly saw that the two have very different methods but happily, with both evidencing great delight! Tessa finds caged, readily visible rats quite off putting but is a ferocious hunter of rats housed in tubes...to the point of drooling with excitement! Dickens has a very high prey drive but is still working out grasping the value in notifying ME of his finds in a less subtle manner. Tessa, now 7, has become a BEAST who can scarcely await her turn in the hay! In just a few months the sport has increased her confidence tremendously —watch out world!

Again, my point: If the first venue(s) proves to be problematic, try something else. Don't settle for less than genuine enjoyment for your dog and aim for more than "oh, my dog just likes whatever with me"! Be wise enough to realize that just because you want to do a sport (including conformation) you are only the lesser half of the "team". And, of course, we all want to be rewarded by success and the greatest successes will only happen when you find the "sweet spot" that YOUR dog truly enjoys! Do NOT be like the exhibitor recently overheard in a Novice Barn Hunt blind who complained that her (obviously unexcited) dog had been trialed 21 times(!) and had found 1 rat thus far! Don't be this person!

Happy dog = Happy human

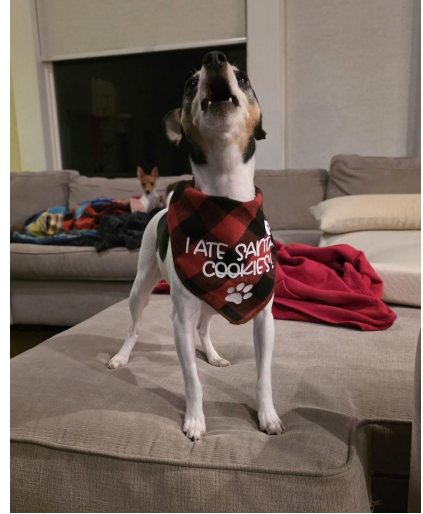

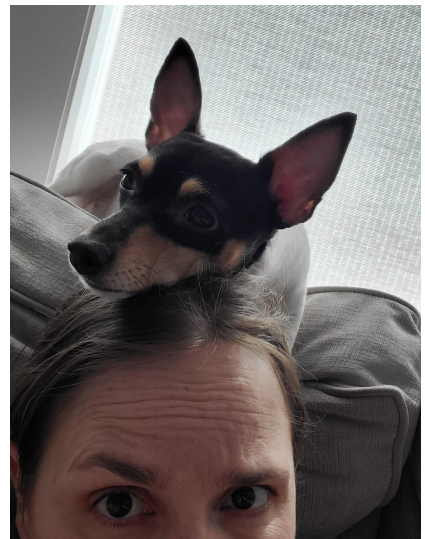

She reads human language with striking clarity and seems to intuit emotion with a sensitivity that feels deeply personal. This heightened awareness is matched by an equally impressive level of discipline. Beckett is fully litterbox trained, a feat in itself, but what truly distinguishes her is her consistency. Over the course of her life, she has had only five accidents outside her designated space—an extraordinary record that reflects both her intelligence and her desire to meet expectations. She is a dog who understands

her world and takes pride in navigating it correctly.

Beckett's pedigree adds another layer to her story. She is the full, older sister to Mila, a top ranked TFT in 2024, 2025, and

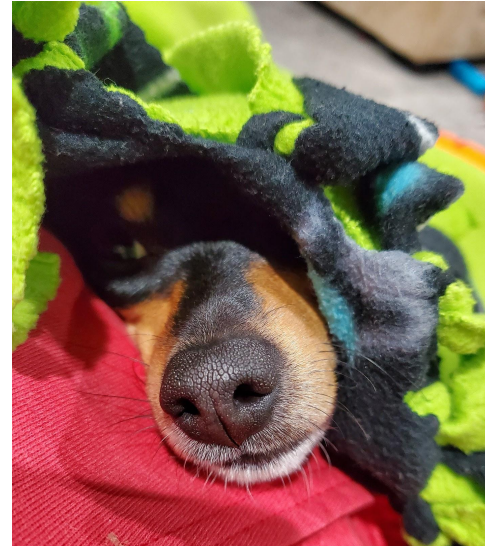

her undeniable quality and presence.

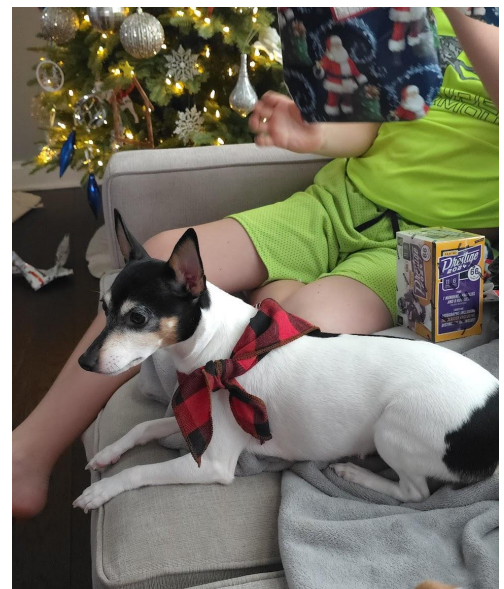

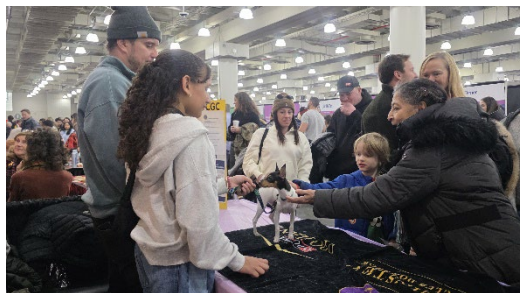
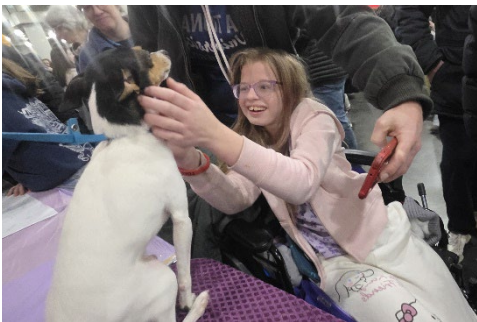


MEET THE BREEDS

History

TOY FOX TERRIER

(Little Brother of the Smooth Fox Terrier)

HISTORY OF THE BREED

To ascertain the history of the popular Toy Fox Terrier, one needs to familiarize himself with the history of the big brother, the smooth fox terrier. The Toy Fox Terrier, just as other toy dogs, has been bred down from the standard size or the larger of the species.

The origin of the smooth fox terrier was developed during different periods of canine history. About 1790 in England, various Fox Terrier clubs quote an authority who stated, "Smooth Fox Terriers were developed from the Black and Tan (Manchester), Bull Terrier, Beagle and the Greyhound. The name Fox was derived from the quarry they pursued." If you have some knowledge of the characteristics of a good hunting dog, it is not difficult to visualize this particular cross. One of the first Fox Terrier clubs was founded around 1885 and it too had variations in the weight limit, as we have today in our Toy Fox Terrier standard.

An interesting part of the history of the Toy Fox Terrier breed in America is that in the early part of the 20th century it was very common to see one or more of these little dogs on almost every farm throughout Kentucky and West Virginia. Most people called them "rat terriers." Being earth dogs they were excellent for hunting rats because they were small and could get under buildings, brush piles, etc. The writer is reminded on one Sunday when a rat hunt was held on one of the farms in his area. The handlers would poke the rats from under the old log houses and the little dogs would catch them. When the day was ended the dogs had accounted for 74 rodents.

As today, with the Toy Fox Terrier customers, requests were varied. "Some wanted the smallest one of the litter, commonly called the 'runt'. Perhaps because they were usually smarter, could move faster and could get under buildings and into holes. There were some who wanted the utility dog or the middle class and others wanted the largest ones for hunting woodchuck, fox and squirrels and to assist in night hunting. All were scrappers. This will account for the way Toy Fox Terriers "gang up" on one another if too many are allowed to run together. Sometimes they pick on one individual and destroy it.

The predominating color markings of the older dog (the big brother) were white bodies with fawn or tan markings. This no doubt, came from the old English Beagle, who was of the same marking. There is no question that the off color dogs of today—blue-black or slate (we call it moltese) are a throw-back to the Bull Terrier and Greyhound which were blue, brindle etc. Too, we occasionally see the round rump (roach back) in some of the modern Toy Fox Terriers which reminds us of the Black and Tan and the Greyhound ancestors which had the same characteristic.

There is some discussion among modern breeders concerning the one characteristic that the Toy Fox Terrier has developed that the big brother did not have—the natural bob tail. Some question the origin. It is the opinion of the writer that it is hereditary due to the many years that the tail has been docked or cut short. Some breeders like this feature, others dislike it. It is simply a matter of opinion. It is, however, very convenient if the tail is the correct length. If too long, it has to be docked, if too short nothing can be done about it and it creates a fault as far as the standard is concerned.

Early in the 20th century (approximately 1910-1915), through the efforts of the breeders and the United Kennel Club, Inc., Kalamazoo, Michigan the Stud Book was opened for registration of the breed. At the beginning, like any other breed of dog, they were few in number but as time went on the breed gained a little each year.

To start with, a few breeders wanted a "one weight dog" and they tried every way possible to gain that end, but without success. Today we have the same situation as was encountered by our forefathers. People want the three weights—small, medium and large—because of the variance in individual reasons for having a dog.

In 1948-49 various state clubs and the National Toy Fox Terrier Association were formed and received their respective charters from the United Kennel Club. The object and purpose of the organizations were many. Briefly, they were to exploit, upgrade, promote and publicize the breed. The results have been gratifying. Today one cannot deny the fact that the Toy Fox Terrier, the little brother of the Smooth Fox Terrier, is the most lovable and popular of all toy dogs.

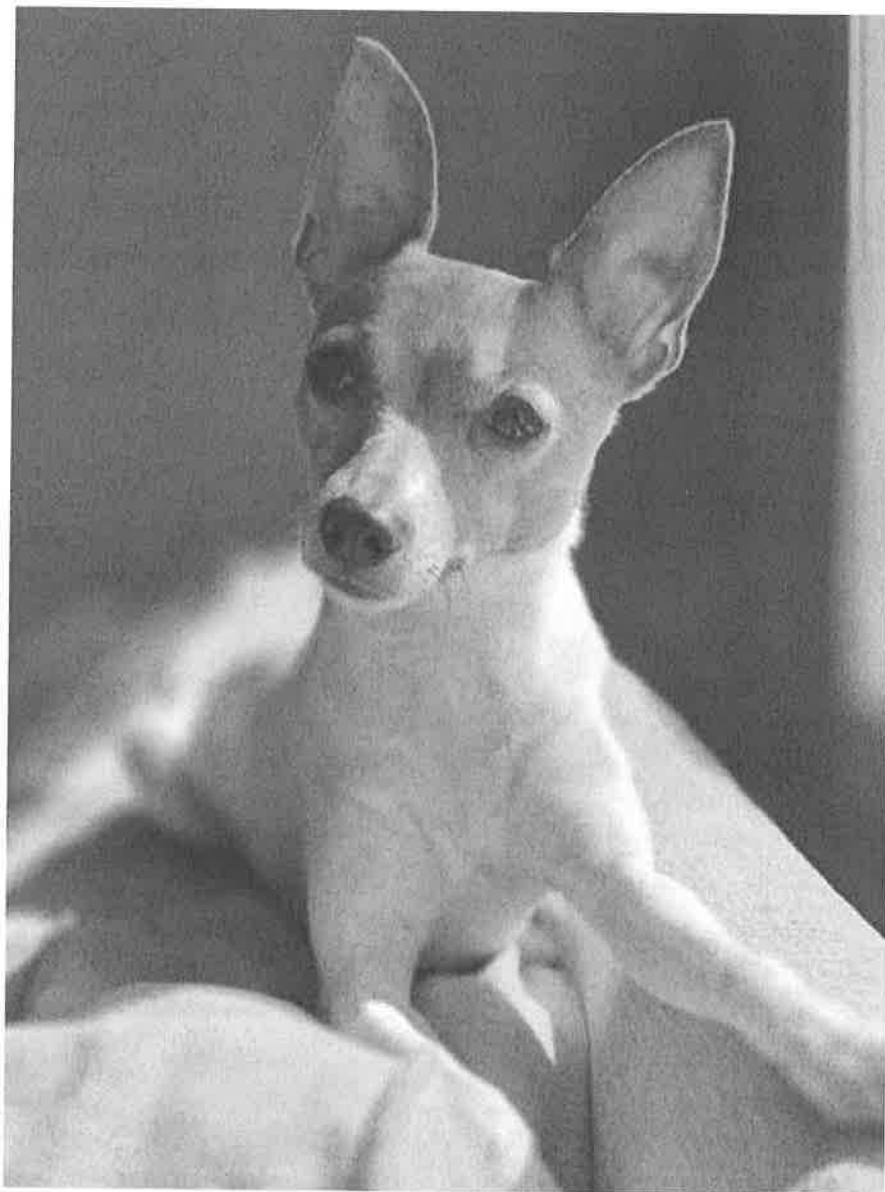
WEIGHTY MATTERS

A number of years ago, I was ringside at a dog show with my first Toy Fox Terrier, waiting to show. A couple walked by with a Toy Fox Terrier in their arms, and seeing my dog, they stopped to admire her and to say they had come to spectate.

They introduced me to their dog, and all I could think was she was the fattest little dog I had ever seen. She had a head and four legs sticking out of a very plump, very round body.

When they walked away, I declared to my husband that I would never have an overweight Toy Fox Terrier.

Recently I had a phone call from a person who had a Toy Fox from me who is now about 8 years old. The owner was concerned because the Toy Fox wouldn't eat and was losing weight. I asked how much weight she had lost, and his response stunned me. He told me she had weighed 13 (!) pounds before her loss of

appetite. Thirteen pounds meant she had gotten quite obese.

I advised him to take her to the veterinarian. He called me a few days later to tell me the vet had diagnosed her with diabetes. She now has to have daily shots.

On social media I often see photos of overly plump, sometimes dangerously overweight Toy Fox Terriers. According to several veterinary websites, dogs are considered overweight when they weigh 10 percent to 20 percent above their ideal body weight; dogs are considered obese when they weigh more than 20 percent above their ideal body weight.

In the U.S., obesity is the most common preventable disease in dogs. Just as with people, a dog being overweight also means a high risk for developing arthritis, diabetes, cancer, and joint issues.

It's no surprise that in a breed which is very food focused, when combined with owners who use treats

and food to show love to their dogs, there will be weight problems.

The first remedy for helping your Toy Fox to lose weight is a strict diet. This may include a low-calorie diet food or a reduction in amounts fed to help your pup reach a healthier weight. Be sure your dog eats at the same time every day, and that you measure the portions carefully based on the ideal weight. I have one-quarter and one-third measuring cups that I use to carefully measure out portions for each dog to ensure they get the specific amount of food required for their size, age, and activity level.

There are often hidden calories consumed by our dogs during the day. When I was campaigning my Toy Fox Sparkles, I noticed she had gained weight. I asked my husband if he was giving her treats, which he denied. Turns out he was letting her lick his plate before he rinsed it and placed it in the dishwasher. When it's a toy

dog, that "cleanup" adds a lot of unnecessary calories. She quickly shed the extra weight when the plate-cleaning stopped.

Treats are another source of calories. Treats for Toy Fox Terriers should be very small and used frugally. I use treats the size of peas. I break treats to make them the right size.

Some fruits and vegetables make healthy, low-calorie treats. My dogs love canned green beans and fresh blueberries.

In addition to carefully monitoring your Toy Fox's diet, exercise is crucial. Go for walks, play fetch, and encourage physical activities that will keep your dog lean and fit.

Show your Toy Fox love with attention and exercise, not treats. Keep your dog a healthy weight and help him or her live a longer, healthier, and more comfortable life.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the AKC Purebred Preservation Bank (AKC PPB) is to ensure the viability of purebred dogs.

This valuable service is necessary to salvage or restore endangered dog breeds now and in the future.

While coordinating efforts with non-profit breed-specific clubs, the AKC PPB will educate breeders, clubs, and the public about the importance of safeguarding frozen semen and protecting purebred dog breeds for future decades.

Donor Information

To date, the AKC PPB has received several semen donor applications that have been accepted into the program. Many of these dogs were referred by our *Partners in Preservation*, saving semen that was to be discarded.

Donors are required to complete a detailed application. Upon submission, it is reviewed by our Gift Review Committee, consisting of three AKC PPB Officers.

When the application is reviewed, donors are asked to complete a Legal Agreement and Transfer of Ownership form. At this point, the semen becomes property of the AKC PPB.

If you are interested in donating, please scan the QR code on the back of the pamphlet, and navigate to the Donor Information page!

Parent Clubs are encouraged to continue providing criteria for both donors and recipients.

AKC[®] Purebred Preservation Bank

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- The AKC Purebred Preservation Bank program is entirely voluntary and optional – for donors of semen, users of semen, and Parent Clubs providing guidance
- AKC PPB is a Charitable Organization under IRC 501(c)(3) – it was established as a mission driven organization without profit motive
- AKC PPB is a separate organization from AKC, and has its own Board of Directors with some representation from AKC
- The American Kennel Club has committed to subsidize and underwrite the expenses of AKC PPB
- AKC PPB does not charge donors or clubs to participate
- Parent Clubs are invited to provide breed-specific questions of sire and semen for donor applications
- Parent Clubs are invited to provide breed-specific criteria for dam and breeder for distribution applications
- The AKC PPB will use Parent Club recommendations except in extenuating circumstances, such as if a breed is threatened with extinction or that breed no longer has a viable Parent Club
- Parent Club approved health statements and CHIC requirements will be consulted
- Parent Club will be notified when an application for distribution is received
- AKC PPB will not distribute semen if the owner still has any semen available
- AKC PPB will only deal with purebred AKC registered dogs (and foreign registerable)
- AKC PPB will not distribute semen unless the breed is determined to be at significant risk
- AKC PPB will continue to welcome questions, comments, and suggestions

Attached please find the Parent Club Registration Stats for your breed, your group(s), and all AKC breeds through the end of 2025.

In addition to the registration data, we are once again including Parent Club Membership data relating to breeder and litter counts. This is located on the last page of the AKC Registration Stats. This data, from 2016 through 2025, gives a general picture of the breeding activity of Parent Club members relative to the overall breeding activity within the breed. ****NOTE:** This data is only as accurate as the membership lists submitted by each Parent Club through the web-based Club Membership Upload Tool and our ability to use email addresses to match members to litters. To ensure accurate information for this and similar projects please make sure your membership data is current..

Once again, we have included in this edition of the PC Stats: Registration Counts by Color. This is located on the second to last page of the AKC Registration Stats.

As with previous distributions of the Parent Club Registration Stats data, please feel free to share the attached information with your club membership as you see fit in order to stimulate discussion about breed specific registration and preservation initiatives.

Important Notes:

As noted in the previous distributions of this information, the attached includes the counts of litters, litter complement, and dogs registered for each year since 2012. The reports also include the counts of unique dogs and bitches that were bred or that participated in a sport. Those counts are finite and will change only minimally over time and generally only due to cancellations of litters, dogs and/or awards. However, the reports also contain numbers that are **“To Date”** which will often change each time we produce these statistics (see definitions below).

Complement: This is the count of pups from each AKC litter.

To Date: There are a number of rows that indicate “to date,” such as “Total Complement in Conformation (to date).” All rows with “to date” information are refreshed every time we reprocess this report. This is so you will have an accurate picture of the puppies produced in any given year. For instance, of the 1,142,364 puppies produced in AKC Litters in 2012 (a.k.a., the Litter Complement for 2012), 41,593 or 3.6% have thus far gone on to participate in conformation as of March 2026. Every time we update this chart, the system looks at all litters from 2012 to see if any additional dogs have started in conformation. Obviously, there will not be many 2012 pups entering Conformation or Breeding for the first time in 2025, but there will be many updates to the information known about pups born in more recent years. Likewise, the “to date” measures for pups born in 2025 will be very low compared to other years because very little time has passed since those litters were whelped; most dogs born in 2025 are still too young for breeding or most AKC sports or titles.

Unique: “Unique” indicates the number of individual dogs participating in an activity such as breeding or exhibiting, counting each unique dog only once. For example, the same dog might have

participated multiple times in a sport during a single year, but is only counted as one unique dog for that entire year, regardless of when each unique dog was born.

“Competing In” vs “Placing In” : While we are able to accurately count unique dogs participating (i.e., entering) in Conformation and Companion events, we do not have complete entry data for all Performance events for the time period. Therefore, you will notice that for Performance Events we provide counts of uniques *placing* in performance. We realize this understates the total dogs participating in Performance sports but this is the best we can do for this sport category.

Again, please feel free to share the attached information with your club membership as you see fit in order to stimulate discussion about registration, how AKC registration processes and procedures can be improved to better support breeders, and to explore how AKC could further assist Parent Clubs in their mission to develop, steward, and preserve their breeds.

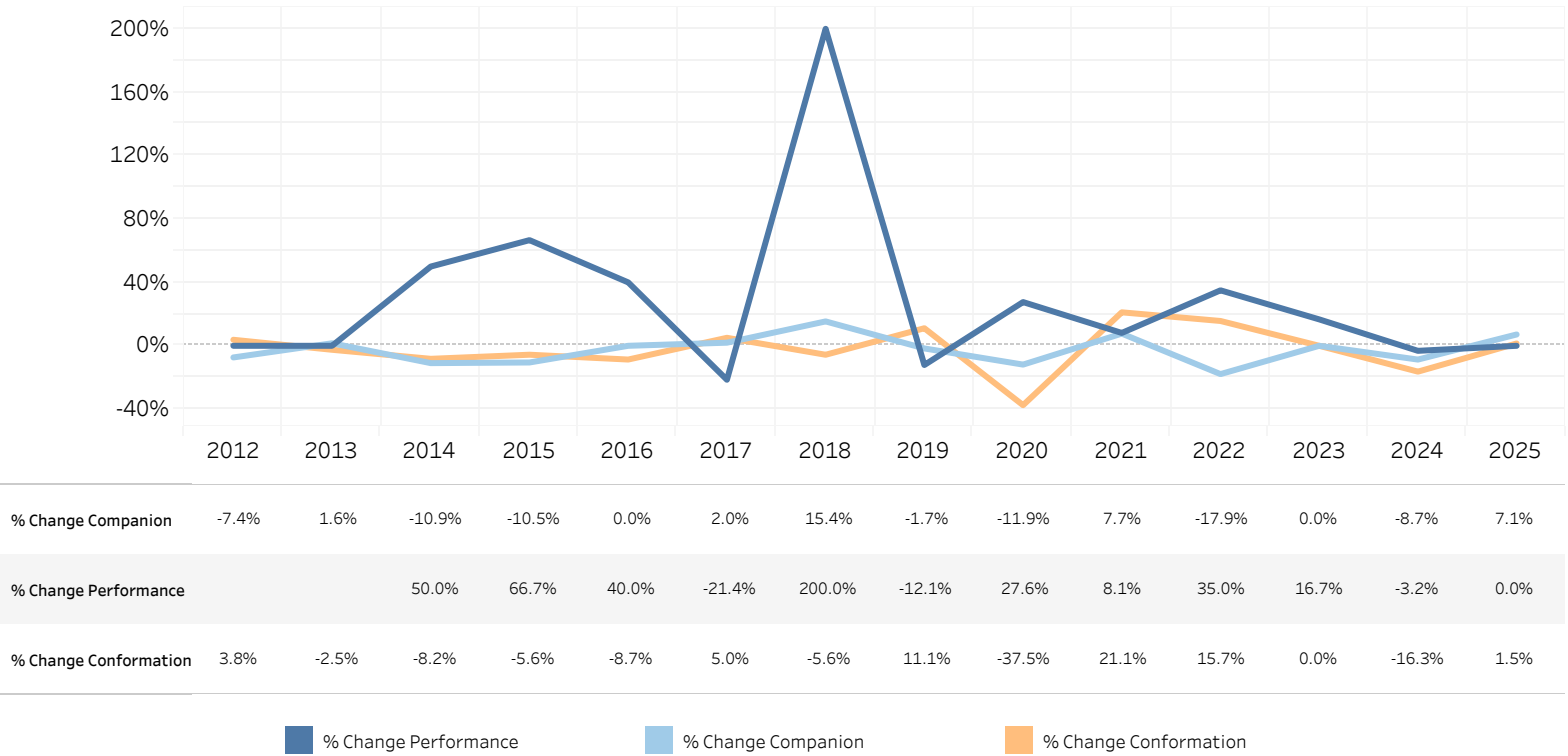
Competing: Total Unique Dogs by Sport Each Year

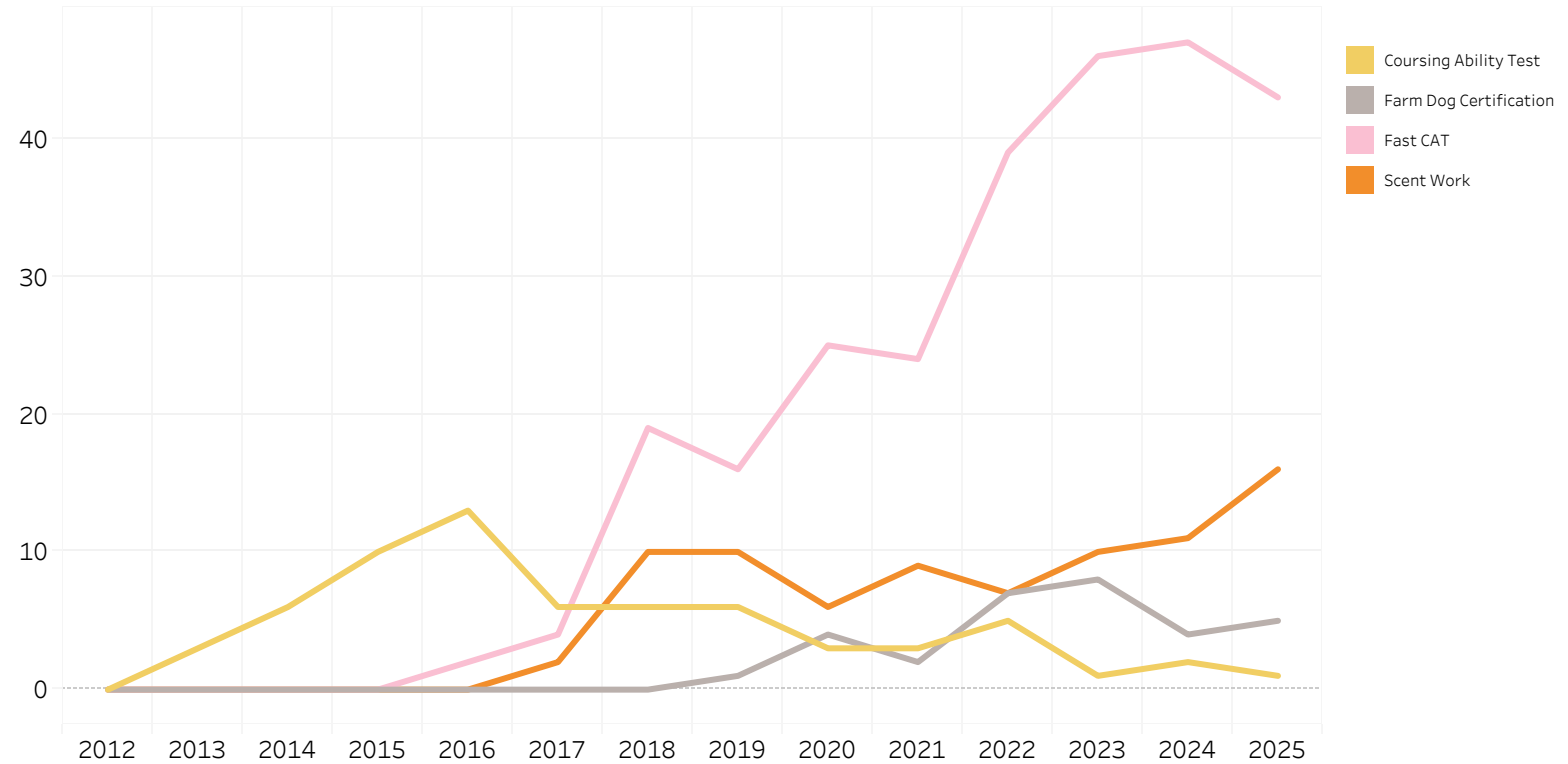
Competing: % Change Unique Total Dogs Year over Year by Sport

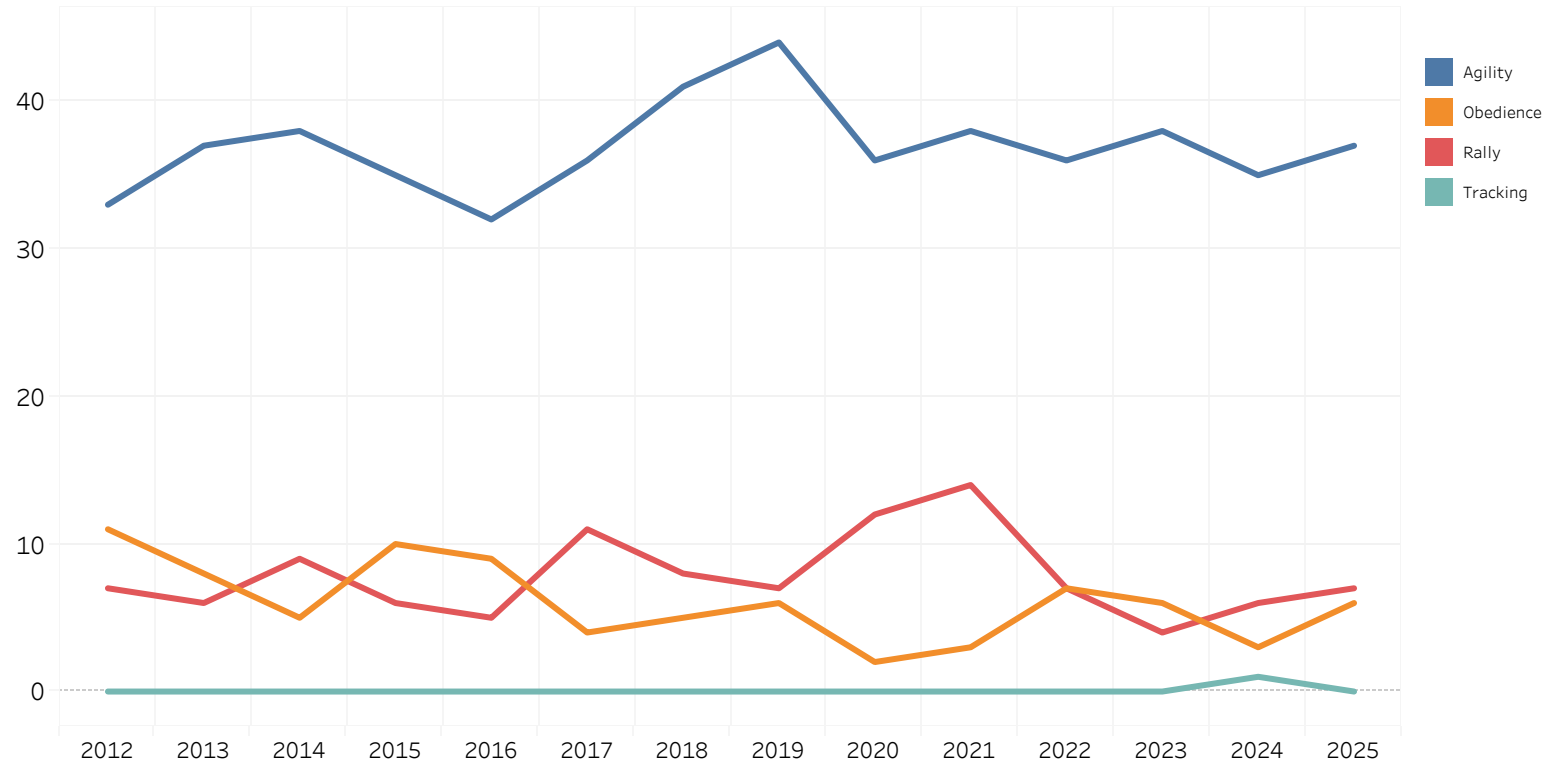
Performance: Total Unique Dogs Placing

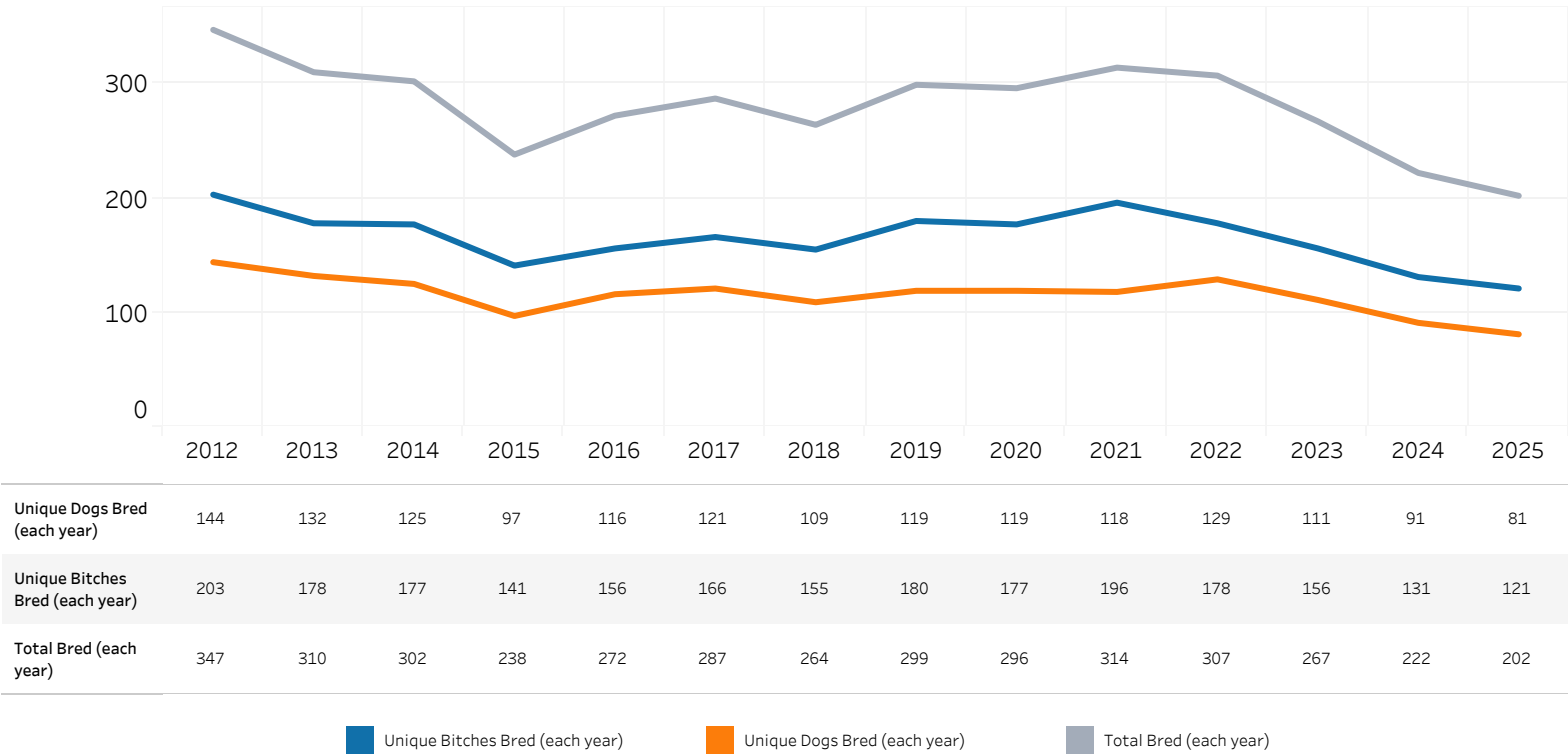
Companion: Total Unique Dogs Entered

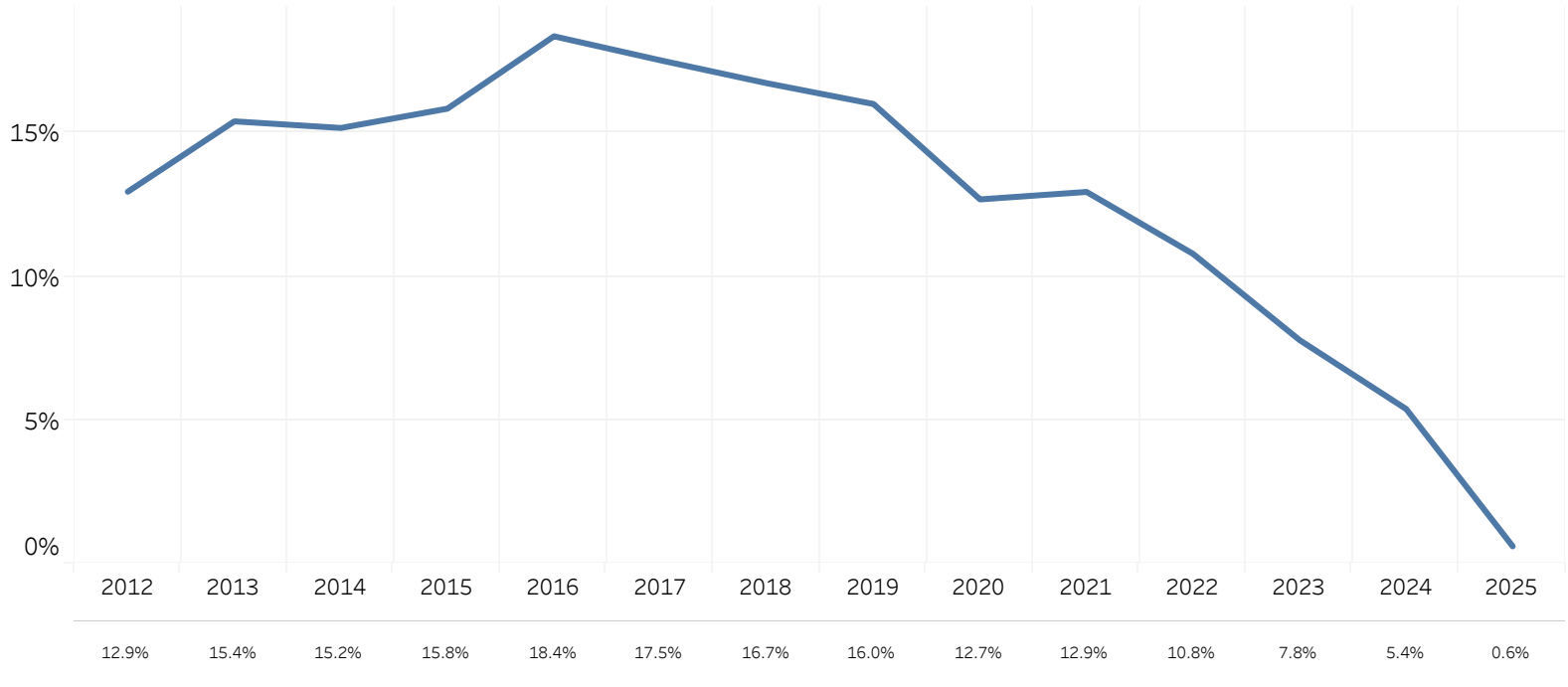
Breeding: Unique Individual Dogs and Bitches Bred Each Year

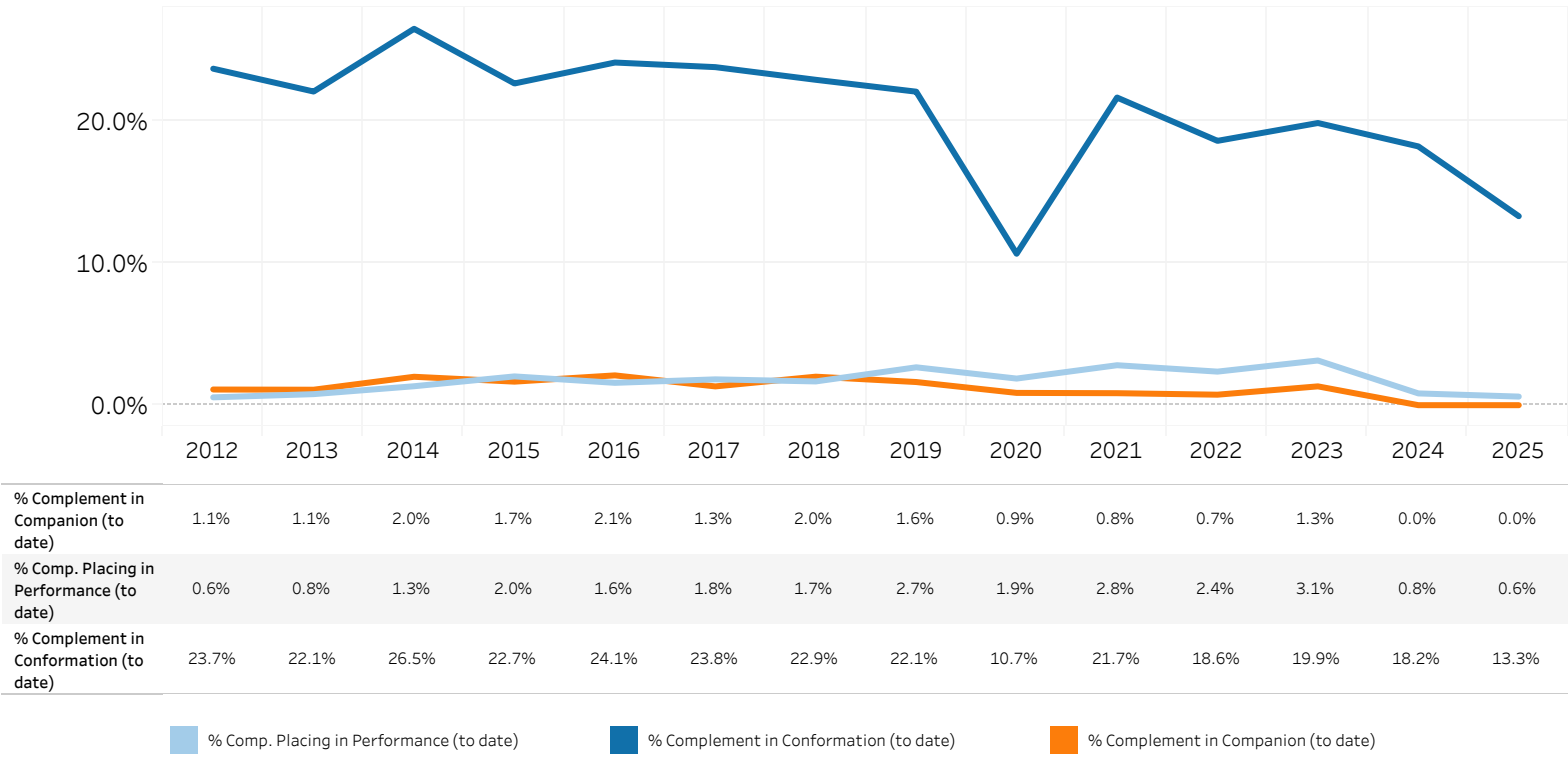
% of Each Year's Litter Complement that have been Bred (to date)

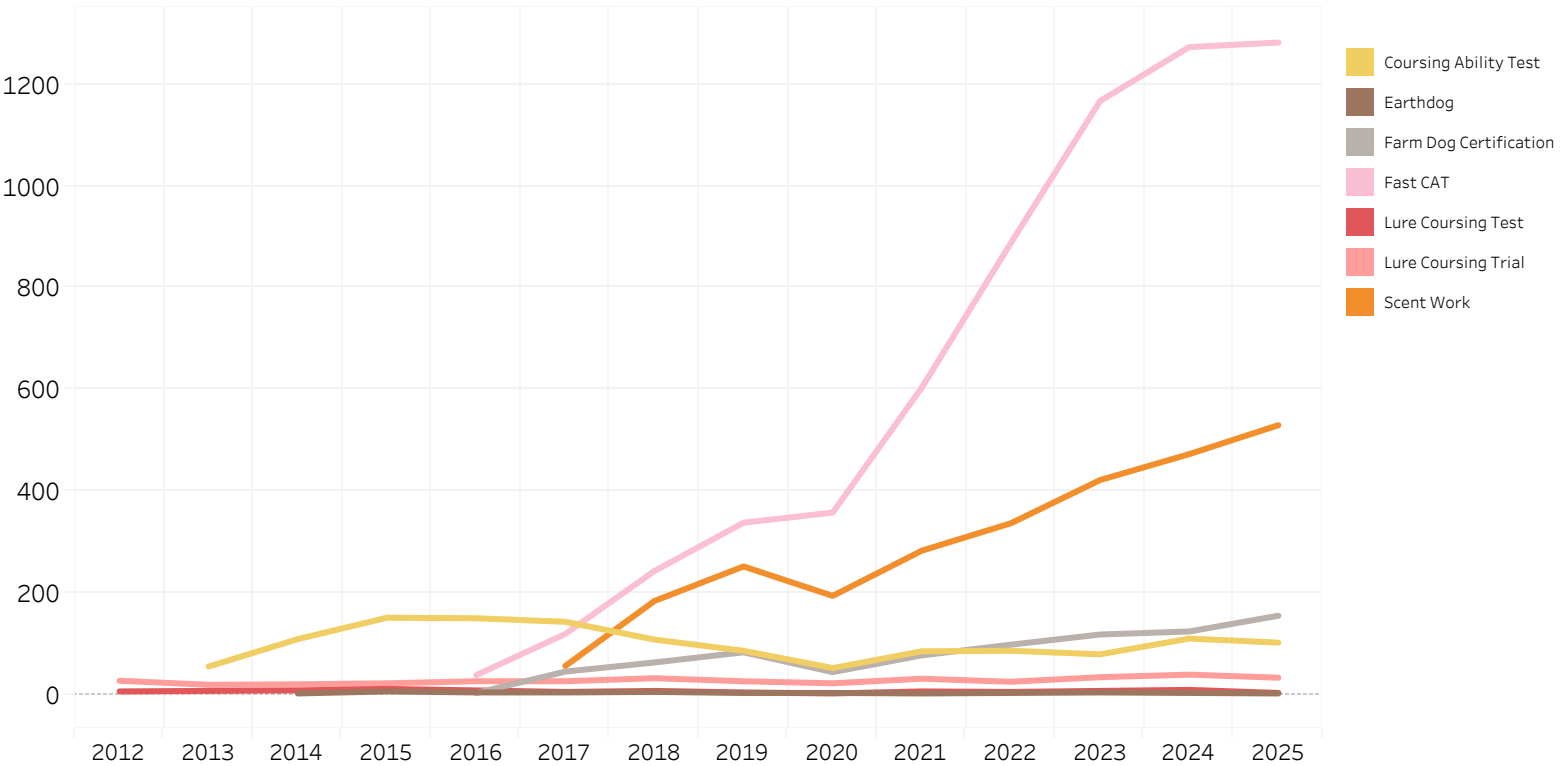
Competing: Total Unique Dogs by Sport Each Year

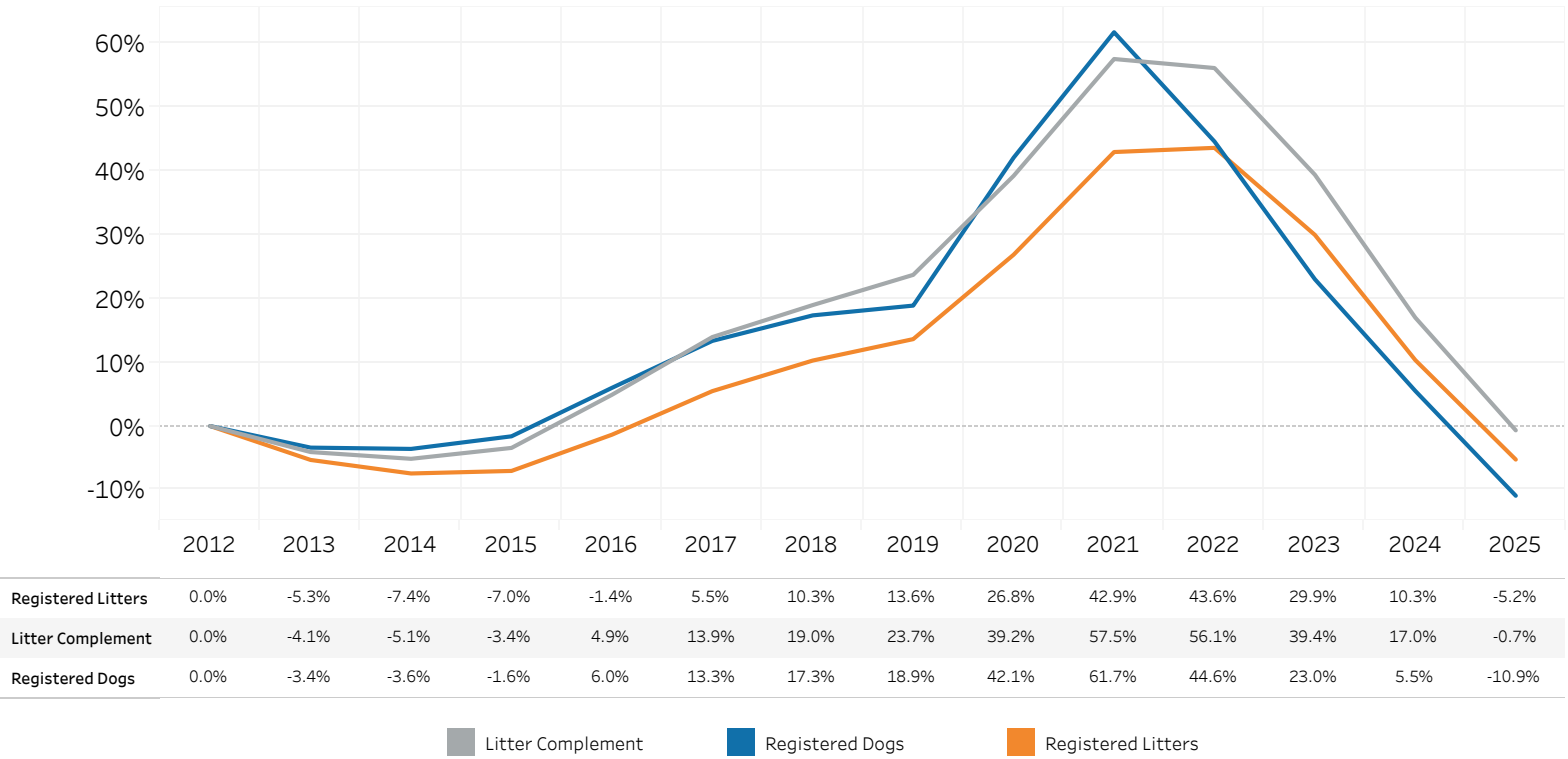
% of Each Years's Litter Complement that were Eventually Registered
